Agreement:

Applicant hereby makes application for using a mooring buoy at the rates as listed below. Applicant agrees to hold harmless the Lake Tahoe Park Association, its members, directors and employees from any claims whatsoever for any loss or damage arising from the use of the mooring, piers or other facilities in connection with this agreement. Applicant further agrees to lease said buoy as is, in its present condition, and to have, at applicant's own expense, general liability and property insurance for use of said buoy; that the signing of said agreement, applicant shall be responsible for any claims of liability arising from applicant and/or applicant's guest, renters, permissive users, or anyone using said mooring buoy with applicant's permission, express or implied. Further, applicant agrees to hold harmless Lake Tahoe Park Association, its members, directors and/or employees from all liability and further facilities. **Applicant expressly agrees not to assign or sublet an Association buoy and acknowledges such action will result in termination of this agreement and loss of deposit.** Apply for one buoy season or date per application and all documents needed on the application must accompany your application or you will not be considered for a buoy. Only a "current registration" can come later in the process. All fees must be with the application including your annual membership assessment.

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BOAT AND BUOY POLICY AGREEMENT

In consideration for the use of a buoy at the Lake Tahoe Park Association beach facility, I, as a boat owner, accept the use of a buoy under the following rules and understand that a violation of these policies will result in forfeiture of the use of the buoy for the current season and elimination of future rights to participate in the buoy selection process.

POLICIES

1. Dinghies are provided at each pier for the use of the boaters. Prior to use, dinghy, oars and life preservers must be checked out from the control building by someone at least 16 years of age. The dinghy, oars and life preservers must be returned and the dinghy locked to the pier.
2. A boat may only use the pier for loading and unloading. The maximum time allowed for docking is 15 minutes.
3. Boats may not be driven and parked on the beach, may not enter the swimming area or be anchored in the water between the first buoy line and the beach.
4. The speed limit in the buoy area is 5 mph.
5. Boaters are to give swimmers the right of way.
6. Boats may not be fueled in the area.
7. A buoy is assigned to one individual and one boat. A boater may not assign the use of their buoy or allow a different boat to be placed on the buoy.
8. Individual non-motorized dinghies may be placed at the south end of the beach or in the designated upper level.
9. Mooring lines must be at least 3/4" with steel shackles on each end.
10. The use of buoys and support of Association dinghies will be from Memorial Day Weekend through Late September.
